Inter alia, the meeting reviewed the work and budget of WCRP and its future plans; considered different proposals regarding the location of the next World Assembly of Religions for Peace; held in depth discussion on the role of religion in the recent transforming events in the Middle East, in which leaders from Tunisia, Iraq and Egypt as well as Pakistan and Indonesia participated.

In addition, special attention was given to the role of religious organizations in relief efforts in Japan.
