

Monthly Highlights October - December 2014

International Interreligious Affairs

London, October 27-29

The International Jewish Committee for Interreligious Consultations (IJCIC) that officially represents the Jewish world in its relations with other world faiths and of which I am a past chairman, held a second colloquium in London with the World Council of Churches Department for Interfaith Relations. The consultation focused on Jewish and Christian attachments to Jerusalem and the Holy Land. Much time was also devoted to the current challenges, discrimination and violence confronting both Jewish and Christian communities. Participants came from four continents.

While in London, in addition to meetings with directors of major national interfaith organizations, I also met with Chief Rabbi of the British Commonwealth Ephraim Mirvis (my successor as chief rabbi in Ireland) and Sir Sigmund Sternberg of the Three Faiths Forum.

Vienna, November 18-21

The quarterly meeting of the Board of Director of KAICIID (the King Abdullah bin Abdulaziz International Center for Interreligious and Intercultural Dialogue) took place at the center in Vienna , pursuant to a momentous conference on Combating the Violent Abuse of Religion, specifically in Iraq and Syria in relation to ISIS. The conference focused on the protection and promotion of the wellbeing of religious minorities. It was attended by major Sunni and Shia leaders from the region, leaders from all streams of Christianity, and from Kurdish and Yazidi communities. This unprecedented solidarity leadership gathering of such diversity from the region issued a declaration condemning the violent abuse of religious and affirming the principal of citizenship regardless of particular religious affiliation.

Vatican City, December 2

On the International Day for the Abolition of Slavery, Pope Francis hosted The Global Freedom Network to eradicate human slavery and trafficking that brought together leaders and representative of the five major world religions to declare modern slavery as a crime against humanity and to work for its eradication.

In a ceremonial act at the Vatican in Cassina Pio IV, a Joint Declaration of Religious Leaders against Modern Slavery was signed by:
