July 28, Krakow, Poland

Pope Francis visited Krakow at the end of July for World Youth Day, the large international gathering of Catholic young people that is held every three years in a different country.

On this occasion Pope Francis visited Auschwitz/Birkenau to pay homage to the victims of the Shoah and I was honored to be invited to be in attendance for that occasion.

Following the Papal visit, the Catholic Center in Oswiecim for Education about the Shoah and Reconciliation hosted a meeting with Cardinal Koch (President of the Pontifical Commission for Religious Relations with Jewry, who accompanied the Pope to Poland), that included Polish Catholic leaders (among them Archbishop Henryk Muszynski) together with myself, Rabbi Avraham Skorka and Rabbi Michael Shudrich the chief rabbi of Poland, to discuss the work of the center and its development.
