# International Interreligious Affairs

### July 9/10, Armenia.

At the initiative of Anthony Barsamian of the Armenian Assembly of America, the outgoing primate of the Armenian Church in the US Archbishop Khajag Barsamian, and with the support of the Israeli Ministry of Foreign Affairs, I visited Armenia to propose an institutional interreligious dialogue with the Armenian Apostolic Church.

I was most graciously received by the Catholicos Karekin II and the leadership of the Church in Etchmiadzin , who discussed and welcomed the proposal. The suggestion was made that a first such meeting might take place next year in Jerusalem together with the Jerusalem Armenian Patriarchate and the Catholicos promised to follow up on all aspects of the proposal.

I was also privileged to meet with President Sarkissian at the presidential palace in Yerevan. Sarkissian has a long-time relationship with AJC, World Jewry and Israel and was very supportive of the dialogue initiative.

I also had the opportunity to meet with the new Armenian Minister of Foreign Affairs Zohrab Mnatsakanian who also strongly encouraged the advancement of such an institutional dialogue.

During my visit I paid my respects to the victims of the Armenian genocide at the impressive museum where I laid a wreath at the memorial monument.
